ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

1. Any O'level passes
2. Applicants over the age of 18 who do not hold the entry requirements could also apply by submitting a certified copy of birth certificate.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

STUDENTS:

Applicants must have attained all of the following entry requirements.

They :

1. Must be over 21 years of age
2. Must be employed in either a full or part time capacity within the hospitality sector
3. Must have completed (with or without exemptions) all subjects and within the hospitality programme.
4. Must undertake a work or industry based search project and produce a report of not less than good words [the nature, content and objectives of the report agreed in advance between the student and ICM.
